Sunrise: Introduction

In 2025 Saltwater Creations celebrated its 10th Anniversary. Since 2015, it has delivered activities to over 9,785 people.

Shoreline: Mission & Goals

The main aim of Saltwater Creations is to encourage individuals to still lead a fulfilling life both personally and professionally, resulting in positive changes in behaviour, focus, performance and productivity, and helping to prepare them for the world of work and future life in general.

Seashells: Impact Metrics

In 2025, we reached over 492 people directly with 33 workshops and activities.

- 272 were young people aged between 4yrs and 25yrs
- 220 were adults
- 114 were repeat users
- 379 were unique users

100% of completed feedback forms (59) evidenced positive feedback, that the sessions had successfully delivered our mission and goals.



Prevailing reasons for using the Saltwater Creations Services:

- Anxiety
- Risk of antisocial behavior, self-harm, exclusion from education
- Lack of life purpose/self-connection causing loneliness and depression
- Low-income families and those in poverty
- Refugees and resettling in locality
- Bereavement
- · Learning new skills and accessing arts
- Carer respite
- Cancer remission
- Learning disabilities
- Relocation to area resulting in need to meet new friends and connect with the local community





Sandcastle Building: Activities and Outputs

We delivered art and creative workshops to groups of vulnerable and disadvantaged people in the community through connections with charity and non-profit groups in the locality.

With specific restricted funding, we were able to work more closely with young people, refugees, people with learning disabilities and those that are at risk of premature departure from educational settings.

We also delivered contracted community work, including a street workshop in conjunction with Artswork Charity and Littlehampton Town Council 'Under the Sea' Family Day. This reached over 64 young people and their families with free accessible arts. We hosted an online Artwork Youth Board session, to create art to reflect key messages to the Charity Board about environmental and climate issues.

Artswork Charity also commissioned Saltwater Creations to host a beach junk modelling workshop with 3 local schools, to support a film and animation project about Marine Protection Zones in our local sea and the rewilding of kelp forests. The 5 short films were premiered at the local cinema where the 250 young people who were involved came to watch. Partners include Sussex Under Water, University of Chichester, Sussex Wildlife and Arun District Council. https://artswork.org.uk/news/arun-kelp-projects. This workshop has now been rolled out to other groups and has resulted in over 70kg of plastic and rubbish being collected from our local beaches.

We delivered a new monthly project called 'Saltwater Sketchers', initially funded by Co-op Community Fund. This is now a monthly arts session at a seafront location in Bognor Regis, open to anyone in the community that may be socially isolated, or who wants to try art or be out in nature. This is run throughout the year so that young people can attend in the school holidays and other members of the community can attend in the daytime sessions if they are not working.

Starfish: Stories & Case Studies

Case Study 1

A counsellor from a young person's mental health charity was at the centre whilst the Saltwater Creations Vitamin Sea workshop was delivered. She decided to join in. Katie* messaged later that evening a profound email of thanks.

'Hi Jules, Last night I went to the beach and collected shells and driftwood for my son's birthday party. Honestly Jules, your session has changed my life! I'm not going to steal your ideas, but it will be such a lovely addition to Leon's* party! Thank you so much. Also, we have two surf boards, and I can't surf but am now considering your idea of just paddling on it when the weather is getting better.

Thank you so much for inspiring me yesterday. I have personally been through a lot with my sons' health for over a year now and have been unbelievably unwell with stress, which is part of why I have had to make the sad decision to leave the shop. I absolutely love the team and couldn't have asked for more support from them, but my own health has been rubbish and couldn't have carried on. Thank you so much and I am getting the surf boards out. Maybe I'll learn to stand on one eventually!'

Rising Tides: Partnership working

Many new community links were made to further the work of Saltwater Creations in 2025. It also enabled Saltwater Creations to signpost individuals to other charities for support (mental health, food poverty and carers support).

Partnerships included: Chichester Development Trust, THE SHED (for young people), Aldingbourne Trust, Jam Community Café, Boys Club Chichester, Phoenix Centre, Club39 (Youth Clubs in Bognor Regis), Felpham Belles Art group, U3A group, Makerspace, Bognor Litter Pickers, Chichester Foodbank, Artswork Charity and VAAC.

Harbour Lights: Funders

Saltwater Creations seeks funding to reach communities for free/low cost, to ensure there is no financial barrier to wellbeing support. A number of funding applications were made to help to take the workshops into the community: Successful applications included: Hyde Housing - Match My Project, Chalk Cliff Trust, Fonthill Foundation, Neighbourly, Southern Co-op Green Fund and Groundwork.

Some funding was restricted to specific projects. Thanks to the **Fonthill Foundation** who awarded a grant to help foster curiosity and inspire young minds of people aged under 25, through the workshops. Thanks to **Neighbourly**, **Southern Co-op**, **Postcode Lottery and Hyde Housing - Match My Project**, for supporting the new beach junk arts workshops. Funding was carried over the financial year end to finish delivering the by year end March 2026.

Ebb and Flow: Challenges & Learnings

- Work to secure unrestricted funding to support core costs and development.
- Promote workshops to profit making organisations to help sustain the offering for free to the non-profit groups.
- Increase Director's time to develop and manage the level of workshops, partnerships, evaluation and marketing of them.
- Focus on arts within the workshops as we have received 100% feedback that this is helping the beneficiary groups to feel calm, relaxed and less anxious.
- Change the model of the CIC to 'Limited by Guarantee' not by shares, to access new funding opportunities.
- Some groups would like a series of workshops to build rapport with the beneficiaries with e.g. sets of 3 sessions as a minimum. We have so far only been able to visit groups for one-off sessions, as funders stipulate, we must reach new individuals with our activities.





Horizon: Looking Ahead 2025-2026

We aim to:

- Continue to reach more people in the community, especially those that are vulnerable or disadvantaged.
- Increase income through more funding applications
- Increase contracted workshops
- Look to relaunch the 'Arts Award' offer, enabling young people to gain a Discovery Arts Award from Trinity College London
- Look to change the governance model from 'Limited by Shares' to 'Limited by Guarantee'. Although no shares have ever been paid out, many funders now only accept applications from 'Limited by Guarantee' CICs.
- Look to increase the Board of Directors, by 1-2 Directors, if appropriate candidates are found.
